Dear Parent/Carer or Student,

NHS Test and Trace: Covid-19 Home Testing

Thank you to everyone for the way that the Covid-19 testing has been conducted in school. Pupils/students have coped very well with these unusual circumstances and the testing centre has continued to operate smoothly thanks to the support of our staff and community volunteers.

Pupils/students who have been tested in school will be provided with a testing kit when they do their final on-site test this week to enable them to continue testing at home. The intention is that each pupil/student will be tested at home twice every week, 3-4 days apart. Participation continues to be voluntary and attendance at school is unaffected if you decide not to take part. There is no requirement to provide online consent for the home testing; please read through the enclosed Privacy Notice, the full instructions for testing that will be sent with the testing kit, and the [NHS 'How to do a Home Test'](#).

The result of each test taken by a pupil/student at home needs to be reported to:

If the test result is positive, then the pupil/student and those in their household (including any childcare or support bubbles) should self-isolate immediately in line with NHS Test and Trace guidance, for 10 full days. A confirmatory PCR test should be booked for the pupil/student, on the same day or as soon as possible.

All existing control measures used in school (such as self-isolation for those displaying symptoms and for those who have been in close contact with someone who has tested positive) remain in place and must be adhered to. This is important for all in school, including for those who receive a negative rapid test result.

The kits that we provide are for pupil/student use only, and at this stage for those who have been tested in school. Once on-site testing is completed we may be able to offer kits to other pupils/students. Further information will be provided if this becomes possible within Department for Education guidance.

ROUNDHAY SCHOOL PRIVACY NOTICE

COVID-19 home testing of pupils and students

Ownership of the Personal Data

To enable the Covid-19 testing to be completed at Roundhay School, we need to process personal, including the sharing of personal data where this is allowed under data protection legislation. Roundhay School is the Data Controller for the data required for the management of tests and implementing local arrangements in the event of a positive test.

We will process personal data relating to pupils and staff under article 6.1(f) of the UK GDPR – it is necessary in the legitimate interest of the data controller. We will process special category personal data under the provisions of article 9.2(i) of the UK GDPR, and Part 1 of Schedule 1(3) of DPA 2018 where it is in the public interest on Public Health Grounds to ensure we can minimise the spread of COVID in a timely manner and enable us to continue to deliver education services as safely and securely as possible. This data is processed under the obligations set out in Public Health legislation (Regulations 3(1) and (4) of the Health Service (Control of Patient Information) Regulations 2002 (COPI)) which allows the sharing of data for COVID related purposes and where it is carried out by a health care professional **OR** someone who owes an equivalent duty of confidentiality to that data.

Ownership of the Personal Data you share with DHSC

Every time you use a lateral flow test you must report the results. More details can be found here - [Report a COVID-19 test result - GOV.UK \(www.gov.uk\)](#). The Department for Health and Social Care (DHSC) is the data controller for the information you transfer to them about you and your test results. For more information about what the DHSC do with your data please see their [COVID-19 Privacy Notice](#)

The school remains the Data Controller for the data we retain about you for the management of tests and implementing local arrangements in the event of a positive test.

You should read both this Privacy Notice and the DHSC COVID-19 Privacy Notice to understand how your personal data is used prior to taking a test.

Personal Data involved

The following personal data is processed by the school in relation to each test:

- Name
- Form and year group
- Date of birth
- Unique code assigned to each individual test and which will become the primary reference number.
- Test result

How we store your personal information

The school will maintain a test kit log which will record against the pupil/student's name details of the testing kit which has been provided. The school may also record Personal Data about you in its internal COVID-19 test register (the school/college's COVID-19 test register will not be shared with DHSC). This information will only be stored securely on locally managed systems with appropriate access controls in school and will only be accessible to personnel involved in the management of tests and implementing local arrangements in the event of a positive test.

The school will retain its test kit log and COVID-19 test register for a period of twelve (12) months from the date of the last entries made by the school into them.

Processing of Personal Data Relating to Positive test results

We will use this information to enact our own COVID isolation and control processes without telling anyone who it is that has received the positive test.

This information will be kept by the school for a period of twelve (12) months and by the NHS for eight (8) years.

Processing of Personal Data Relating to Negative and Void test results

We will record a negative and void result for the purpose of stock controls of tests and general performance of the testing process.

Data Sharing Partners

The personal data associated with test results will be shared with

- DHSC, NHS, PHE – to ensure that they can undertake the necessary Test and Trace activities and to conduct research and compile statistical information about Coronavirus.
- Your GP – the NHS may share the information you provide with your GP to maintain your medical records and to offer support and guidance as necessary. Any data you provide to the [school/college] will not be shared with your GP.
- Local Government to undertake local public health duties and to record and analyse local spreads.

Personal Data in the school's test kit log will be shared with DHSC to identify which test kit has been given to which individual in the event of a product recall. The school will not share its internal COVID-19 results register with DHSC.

Your Rights

Under data protection law, you have rights including:

Your right of access - You have the right to ask us for copies of your personal information.

Your right to rectification - You have the right to ask us to rectify personal information you think is inaccurate. You also have the right to ask us to complete information you think is incomplete.

Your right to erasure - You have the right to ask us to erase your personal information in certain circumstances.

Your right to restriction of processing - You have the right to ask us to restrict the processing of your personal information in certain circumstances.

Your right to object to processing - You have the right to object to the processing of your personal information in certain circumstances.

Your right to data portability - You have the right to ask that we transfer the personal information you gave us to another organisation, or to you, in certain circumstances.

You are not required to pay any charge for exercising your rights. If you make a request, we have one month to respond to you.
